

A+ Sant'Anna Institute Summer

This exciting program, which begins at the end of May and runs through until the beginning of August, gives students a chance to enrol in one of three sessions that are taking place. Summer session I and II are 5 weeks in length and consist of one to two courses. Summer III, which is 10 weeks in length, consists of two to four courses.

An optional internship opportunity is also available. Situated in the town of Sorrento, Sant'Anna offers courses taught in English in various areas ranging from Business to Humanities, Culture to Classical Studies and much more. This program also includes many fun and exciting excursions.

These excursions are built around you getting out of the classroom and gaining an insight and understanding into the communities and cultures of the area that you are in.

A+ Arcadia in London

Boost your résumé in one of the world's most dynamic global capitals. Engage with London as both a professional and a student, mixing with British, American and international students and interning eight hours a day, three full days per week.

This Arcadia+ internship option includes a placement and a research project. One-to-one attention with your supervisor helps you to choose your topic of research and to connect your experience with your career aspirations. The paper associated with your project also acts as a strong writing sample for graduate school and employment application for students in the 300-level of the course.

You will also choose three courses from a varied selection at the Arcadia London Center. 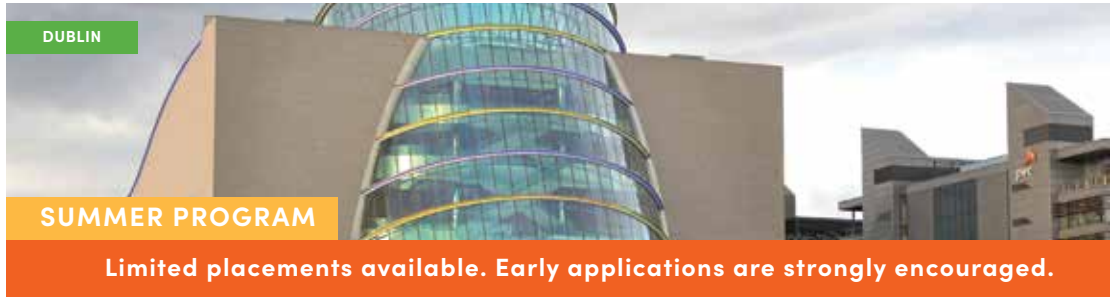
